5. **Identification and description of your school pest problem(s).**

*Insects and Rodents*

The Central Fulton School District has historically had problems with roaches, ants, mice and bees. The mice are usually noticed in the fall as the weather cools. The roaches are seen year-round. Ants are normally seen in the spring through late summer and bees normally through the summer months. The ants and mice are primarily found around any food storage or kitchen areas. Bees are commonly found building nests in the exterior of the school buildings. Roaches are normally found in and around pipe chases, locker rooms, restrooms and kitchen areas.

We have a contract with **Home Team Defense LLC** for our pest management. They visit our facilities monthly to place glue boards, gel baits and ant traps. During their monthly visit, we direct them to any problem areas in the district.

*Weeds*

Traditionally, our licensed technicians spray for weeds in our lawns, athletic fields and fence rows. Typically, for weed control, we use Honcho Plus. For broadleaf weed control, we spray with Trimec or use granular fertilizer with Trimec.

6. **Description of your school IPM Information Flow (communications strategy) and Training Format.**

Brent S. Seville (IPM Coordinator) will meet monthly with the District's pest control contractor and quarterly with the committee members to discuss problems and solutions. The log binders will be kept in the maintenance room, which will include application dates and materials used. There will also be work order sheets

available to all staff members who need to report a particular problem.

**7. A record of chemical pesticide(s) applied on school property.**

**Home Team Defense LLC** is our licensed pesticide contractor. Indoors, we use gel bait for roaches and ants. Sticky boards are used for mice. Flying insect spray is used primarily for bees.

**8. A record of non-chemical actions taken on school property.**

- a. We keep monthly records from **Home Team Defense LLC** on applications and materials used for pests.
- b. Maintenance personnel keep records of ground maintenance such as fertilizers, pesticides and chemicals used for weeds and broad leaf control.

Time of use, materials used, amounts used and weather conditions are all recorded.

The school district has two Category 23 public applicators, licensed with the PA Department of Agriculture. Category 23 covers all chemical applications inside and outside of the district buildings.

At least once a year, the IPM committee will meet with the pest control contractor to evaluate the success or failure of this IPM plan.
