



Central Fulton School District Free & Reduced Meal Information



Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. The Central Fulton School District cafeteria offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$.75; lunch costs \$1.25, \$1.40 & \$1.65. Your children may qualify for free meals or reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch.

Frequently asked questions:

1. **Do I need to fill out an application for each child?** No. Complete the application to apply for free or reduced price meals. Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. **Return the completed application to Annette Gress in the cafeteria.**
2. **Who can get free meals?** Children in households getting Food Stamps or TANF and most foster children can get free meals regardless of your income. Also, your children can get free meals if your household income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Guidelines.
3. **Can homeless, runaway and migrant children get free meals?** Please call our school, homeless liaison/migrant coordinator, Debra Schetrompf at 485-3183 ext. 247 to see if your child(ren) qualify, if you have not been informed that they will get free meals.
4. **Who can get reduced price meals?** Your children can get low cost meals if your household income is within the reduced price limits on the Federal Income Chart, shown on this application.
5. **Should I fill out an application if I got a letter this school year saying my children are approved for free or reduced price meals?** Please read the letter you received carefully and follow the instructions. Call the school at 485-3195, ext. 233 and ask for Annette should you have any questions.
6. **I get WIC, can my child(ren) get free meals?** Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please fill out an application.
7. **Will the information I give be checked?** Yes, we may ask you to send written proof.

8. **If I don't qualify now, may I apply later?** Yes. You may apply at any time during the school year if your household size goes up, income goes down, or if you start getting Food Stamps, TANF or other benefits. If you lose your job, your children may be able to get free or reduced price meals.
9. **What if I disagree with the school's decision about my application?** You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to Dr. Julia M. Cigola, District Superintendent at 485-3183.
10. **May I apply if someone in my household is not a U.S. citizen?** Yes. Your or your child(ren) do not have to be a U.S. citizen to qualify for free or reduced price meals.
11. **Who should I include as members of my household?** You must include all people living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives or friends). You must include yourself and all children who live with you.
12. **What if my income is not always the same?** List the amount that you normally get. For example, if you normally get \$1,000 each month, but you missed work last month and only got \$900, put down that you get \$1,000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but not if you get only sometimes.
13. **We are in the military; do we include our housing allowance as income?** If your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. All other allowances must be included in your gross income.
